

day 12: I'll bring you the moon and even some stars!

Today we will bring the moon to our room, and create a beautiful one ourselves! Enjoy this crafty activity!



1. Grab a piece of cardboard (ideally from a box) or cardstock, and draw a big circle (25-30cm). Cut it out with some scissors.




4. Paint the moon white using your white paint and a brush. The glue must be dry by now, so you will see the great tecture craters have on its surface!



2. Add some "craters" with the school glue, so we add a bit of texture to our moon. The more dots and craters, the better!



5. Dip the crumpled foil on the white, grey, yellow paint, and rub it on the moon in patches. Patchy rubs pressing and releasing will make it look ultra cool!



3. Get some aluminum foil from the kitchen and crumple it so that it fits inside a measuring cup, for example. This will be our crater brush;)





6. There's a moon in my room now!!!!
You can paste it with tape, or hang it with string!
